Positive Strides in Challenging Times

When I think about TheHandi-Van and the exceptional service our team provides, I am amazed and so grateful to be a part of a Company that goes above and beyond to serve our clients with the true spirit of Aloha. No matter how hard or challenging the task of maintaining this service may be, everyone works together to provide the best public transportation service for our kupuna and many of those in our community who are eligible to utilize TheHandi-Van.

The past year has had its obstacles on so many different levels of service. From June 2022 through December 2022, our call center phone statistics were poor due to shortages in staffing. We were happy to be able to hire the staff we needed to attain service requirements set by the Department of Justice (DOJ). Our positive strides will ensure we maintain the requirements set forth by the DOJ for the next three years. As of today, our reservationists are on track and answering calls within three minutes at 97 percent and within five minutes at 99 percent! On average, they answer 38,000+ calls in a month, all while maintaining their high level of professionalism and customer service.

On average, TheHandi-Van provides approximately 3,000 trips on weekdays and our supplemental providers approximately 250 trips. In order to effectively process all these trips, our scheduling team manually takes these trips and builds the runs which produce the Operators' manifests on a daily basis. With their staff of five on duty, it amazes me how they achieve and manage this grueling task.

Our Dispatchers, Operations Clerks, and Operators do an outstanding job of maintaining the day-to-day operations. Each day, our Dispatchers are tasked with finding runs to manage the unscheduled bucket. The number of unscheduled clients could range from 100 to 300. The tedious task of finding runs and Operators to assist can become overwhelming. Many factors contribute to this such as shortage of staffing and high downed vehicle counts.

We are grateful that the Department of Transportation (DTS) agreed to purchase ten Nissan Rogues to add to our vehicle count. DTS also purchased 48 new Starcraft cutaways to replace some of our aging fleet. We are scheduled to receive all 48 by the end of November 2023. We are currently in collaboration with DTS to plan future procurements of vehicles that will best serve our clients.

The dedication of our staff, which includes our maintenance team, is commendable. Everyone working together and doing their best in running a smooth operation does not go unnoticed. Our Executive team, Managers, and Supervisors are grateful that all of you provide this service and are truly, "Driven by the Spirit of Aloha"!

Moving forward, we are working to improve communication at all levels and provide more opportunities for growth within OTS. With these efforts, we hope to exemplify the mission statement for TheHandi-Van and all who utilize our services.

OTS `Ohana Continues to Overcome and Move Forward

Looking back over the last three years, I am in awe of how we navigated through so many challenges together, and here were are, still blessed with a great purpose to serve our communities daily through transit. Your resilience and dedication is second to none. With Skyline in operation, new technology, and aspirations from our City leaders, there is always something in the works at OTS and we are gearing up for the new challenges ahead.

In July 2023, OTS implemented significant new bus service to complement Skyline from Kapolei to Aloha Stadium. We expect significant changes to bus service again in 2025 when Skyline's Middle Street and Lagoon Drive stations open. Service plans for these stations are not final; i.e., we are in discussion with the City about possibly extending the Route 20 as an express line from Middle Street to Waikiki as well as putting in circulators at the Lagoon Drive station for the Salt Lake community. We will definitely have meetings with operators to communicate the changes, put out material on changes as soon as available, and post videos of new routes like we did for the service implemented in July 2023.

Transitioning to new technology is not new to OTS, and the staff always does an excellent job of working through the obstacles that come with such change. Electric buses ("e-buses") and smart cards are a couple of areas where we have experienced significant change and continue to see evolve.

With a fleet of 17 Gillig e-buses, both our operations and maintenance teams have learned a lot about electric buses over the last two years. Although the overall feedback from operators is that they like how the e-buses run, challenges with chargers and batteries occur from time to time. Over the next few years, we will learn a lot more as the e-bus fleet ages including how durable the e-bus parts are and how quickly batteries degrade in reality. In the meantime, the technology of e-buses, batteries and chargers continues to improve.

With only 17 e-buses out of our 480-bus fleet, managing the operational challenges (i.e., limited mileage range, long periods to charge, etc.) is manageable. However, as our e-bus fleet grows, we will need more robust and adequate charging infrastructure. Additionally, our operations will require sophisticated software tools to properly schedule routes by range of each bus fleet, schedule charging times within allowable charging time frames, and manage the buses on the road to ensure their state of charge remains adequate to complete their routes.

The City's plan is still to have a 100% e-bus fleet by the end of 2040, and their current bus procurement plan is to procure only e-buses starting in 2025. The greater challenge than buying buses is building adequate charging infrastructure to efficiently charge 500-plus e-buses. As you can see at Kalihi, because of the amount of electricity needed to charge a bus, charging infrastructure takes up a lot of space and is very costly. Recently, the City has discussed overhead charging at Alapai Transit Center and additional depot charging at the Pearl City Facility. The City's plan to have 100% electric buses by the end of 2040 is a noble goal; however, given the aforementioned challenges, including a very tight budget in the

upcoming fiscal years, I believe the City may need to adjust its plan. Nonetheless, OTS strives to do what is within its control, which means that adequate staffing and training for our maintenance staff is at the forefront of our minds as we plan for the future of a larger e-bus fleet. Currently, we are in early discussions with the City about an electric fleet for TheHandi-Van. While a completely different operation from TheBus, TheHandi-Van faces the same challenges regarding sufficient charging infrastructure, range, and efficiency.

After successfully rolling out the HOLO smart card on TheBus, our TheHandi-Van team fully rolled out HOLO to riders in July 2023. The City anticipates having the HOLO card validators in some form (possibly a phone application) for our supplemental providers who help complete our 3,600-plus daily trips. In the more distant future, the City has its eyes set on mobile ticketing options for customers. The City aspires for our riders to be able to plan (Bus, Handi-Van, Skyline, Bikeshare, etc.), track their transit, and pay for their fare through a single mobile application. As for now, I am still excited about the HOLO smart card and the fact that our operators do not need to worry about certain things like transfers and there is less cash. There could come a day when we are completely cashless; but that is a long ways off.

Lastly, it was so nice to restart our Employee Appreciation/Roadeo event this past summer. Although there was not a national roadeo competition this year, we decided to do the roadeo because first, it was fun for all and well-deserved, and second, we wanted to get our operators and mechanics ready to compete in our official qualifying roadeo event in December. Yes, we are getting back on our holiday annual Employee Appreciation/Roadeo event this December! The winners of this upcoming roadeo will be able to compete in the national bus and paratransit roadeo competitions in 2024. More details to come!





State of Charg

Vice President, Planning and Technology

After a little over a year of time on the road, Honolulu's fleet of electric buses has performed, well, adequately. We have definitely put them to the test, running these vehicles as long and often as possible. They have been performing as advertised, meeting their original mileage estimates of 140 miles on a full charge and charging time of about 2 ½ hours. We have run into a few charging and charger issues but for the most part the buses

have been available for revenue service. The operators like the drivability, and the noise reduction and elimination of exhaust fumes are huge benefits for the community. On the downside, the cost of electricity from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. is extremely high and prohibits the buses from being recharged in that period. Our fleet is still small at 17 vehicles and with nine chargers, opportunities are available in the middle of the day to recharge. This is typically when buses return from the peak morning commute. We have learned that orchestrating the charging will become significantly more challenging as the fleet grows. They will be needed on long vehicle blocks and additional infrastructure will be required. However, with technological advancements in battery capacity and faster charging capabilities, electric buses do show a lot of promise.



Employee Safety Reporting Program (ESRP)

Eric NakashimaDirector of Safety and Security

In an effort to make Oahu Transit Services, Inc., (OTS) a safer place to work, we are in the process of moving away from a System Safety method of monitoring safety, which has been mostly reactive, to a Safety Management System (SMS), which is a data driven and a more proactive method to monitor safety. In doing this, there are many steps OTS must take as a company. One of those steps is to insure we are aware of not only all work-related injuries and illnesses, but that we are also aware of any near miss (close call) incidents and/or hazardous conditions, which may exist in the workplace. To aid us in accomplishing this, we have created the Employee Safety Reporting Program (ESRP). ESRP is an application that is available to all employees through the apps page on your work or personal computer/mobile device by simply pointing your internet browser to apps.thebus.org and using your credentials to log in. The ESRP app will be the best and soon required way to submit workplace injury. illness, near miss, and hazardous condition reports. All employees are required to report work-related injuries and illnesses, but currently that is done by hand on a paper injury/illness report form. ESRP will eliminate the paper process and create a simple and efficient way to fill out and submit a report, which will be tracked to completion.

What will be new and unfamiliar for some, is the ability to report near miss incidents and hazardous conditions in the workplace by utilizing the ESRP platfrom. The reason near miss and hazardous condition reporting is an important factor in SMS is that if investigated promptly and properly, these types of reports gives us the best chance to mitigate and possibly eliminate hazards before an accident occurs, hence, being proactive. To encourage near miss or hazardous condition reporting, the ESRP will give you an option to remain anonymous when submitting a report. However, keep in mind if you choose to report anonymously, the report will be investigated but you will not personally receive any updates on the outcome of the investigation or receive credit for bringing these conditions to our attention. Remember, safety is everyone's responsibility and if you are not sure if you should report something, consider what could happen to a co-worker or someone else if you don't. If you have any questions about ESRP or any Safety issue, do not hesitate in contacting the Safety office.

Sustainability Projects

The City and County of Honolulu has been intently concentrating on vehicle electrification, yet that is not the only sustainable initiative they have underway. At present, they have implemented multiple projects across our facilities to reduce electricity and water consumption.

The replacement of all the transformers throughout both facilities was the first electrical project that was completed earlier this year. These new transformers outperform the older ones that were replaced in terms of efficiency, noise level, and heat output. The facility LED light replacement is the second project that is still in progress. In some already-finished areas, the quantity of energy used decreased by 50%. The final project, which just got underway, involves the installation of photovoltaic (PV) panels at both facilities. These PV systems will provide power to the buildings at both locations as well as the bus chargers at the Kalihi facility.

At this time, the only water conservation project that has been completed is the replacement of the toilet flush valves. The new valves drastically reduce water consumption. Due to the decreased water flow, we would like to remind our employees to be mindful of what they flush down the toilets. Items not intended for flushing can

clog pipes and damage the plumbing infrastructure. Furthermore, the City is considering the installation of water-saving showerheads and faucets.

These initiatives aim to reduce our carbon footprint and contribute to a more sustainable future.

Evolution of Public Transportation

When you hear of evolution, what do you think of it? Most people think of evolution as a generational change of plants and animals. Have you ever thought of the evolution of public transportation? If we look back over the last century, the look of buses have changed dramatically from horse-drawn carriages to battery electric buses. On Oahu, streetcar operations began in the early 1900s and evolved into trolleybuses into the 1950s. The City and County of Honolulu has been providing public transportation since the 1970s with its first 50 buses being bought from a Dallas-based transit system. Today we have over 480 buses in our fleet, and they range in a variety of sizes from a single-door 30-foot bus to a three-door 60-foot articulated bus. Buses have benefited from changes throughout the years, which have included air-conditioning, wheelchair lifts, and smartcard technology for fare recovery.

We are currently testing three new products in our vehicles, a semiactive driver seat, a video mirror system, and on-board infotainment monitor. The semi-active driver seat uses a computer-controlled suspension system as well as an advanced computer-aided height adjust system to provide a smooth feeling while driving over large bumps and potholes on the road. The video mirror system replaces traditional outside mirrors with a high-definition digital camera and interior displays. The mirror system provides a wider angle of view on the road allowing you to make safer driving decisions. Onboard infotainment monitors can provide passengers with real-time locations, schedules, and a variety of promotional content. We are also looking at ways to improve our road supervisor vehicles and shuttle cars, possibly adding a more sustainable hybrid or electric vehicle for the non-revenue fleet. Nowadays, technological advancements and innovations are being provided to enhance the driver and rider experience, but the purpose has always remained the same, to provide safe, efficient, accessible, dependable public transportation to the riding public.



Civil Rights Office (CRO)

Civil Rights Office (CRO) is committed to creating a workplace free from discrimination and harassment through training and timely, impartial review of complaints in accordance with civil rights laws. Through impartial investigations, resolution of complaints, developing policy, providing technical assistance and discrimination awareness and prevention training, the CRO administers an effective program and process for filing and investigating complaints of discrimination for all OTS employees.

My second full year in the CRO has been very busy. The Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) laws are always evolving, as such, solidifying a consistent training program is a CRO goal this year. The majority of employees, managers, and executive staff received at least an hour of training in EEO over the last year. In addition to having in-person training, the CRO partnered with Planning and Technology, Customer Service, Safety and Security, Transportation and Human Resources to provide on-demand, on-line training located at https://apps.thebus.org. Since January 1, 2023, we were able to provide EEO training to 87% of the OTS staff! Although not CRO-related, there's also the newest on-demand, online De-Escalation training for bus operators, which has been live for over a month and 18% of the operators have already completed it!

Another area the CRO is working on providing is Supervisory Training that is dedicated to the needs of the OTS staff. This next year, the CRO hopes to add more classes, such as Ethics and Discipline.

The CRO also provides support to employees involved in tough situations at work. When the CRO is notified that an employee is involved in a challenging event at work, the CRO reaches out to the employee with an email to acknowledge the event and offer support. Support comes in the form of talking, meeting, and referrals for service such as the Employee Assistance Program with Employee Assistance of The Pacific, LLC, which is a benefit provided by OTS.

Advance Yourself, Your Career, and Our Culture

Twenty-three years ago when I was hired as an Entry Clerk Typist in the Halawa Transportation Office, I was happy and satisfied with a steady income, schedule, and benefits, as well as a supportive manager and coworkers. Never in my wildest imagination did I dream of becoming the Vice President of Human Resources & Labor Relations. Most people outside of OTS are surprised at that career path, but my story is not unique at OTS. In fact, seventy-four percent (74%) of our managers at OTS started from an entry level position (operator, fueler, mechanic, or clerk). The culture of OTS to promote from within is a beautiful aspect of the company. However, it is important for all of us to cultivate a growth mindset and a culture of continuous learning to ensure the success of OTS in the future.

OTS has provided general supervisory training to all management staff through Hawaii Employers Council and encourages attendance at seminars/webinars specific to the department's needs. In addition to new hire orientation and operator training, our Training Department provides annual refresher, drug and alcohol reasonable suspicion, CPR, and other training programs. One of the goals of the Human Resources Department and the Civil Rights Office is to develop an internal management/leadership training program for current management and employees desiring to advance their careers. As this is being developed, what steps can you take now to grow yourself and your career?

Read. I cannot emphasize enough the importance of reading to remain current and to expand your perspective. At OTS, be sure to check your email daily for announcements, policy updates, and newsletters. Familiarize yourself with your collective bargaining agreement and company policies. Subscribe to newsletters in your industry or areas of interest. Read books on leadership and personal growth such as The Anatomy of Peace by The Arbinger Institute, Atomic Habits by James Clear, Developing the Leader Within You by John Maxwell, and Don't Sweat the Small Stuff by Richard Carlson. If you do not enjoy reading, try listening to an audiobook during your commute. There are books available for you to borrow from the Training Department and you can also borrow books/ebooks/audiobooks through the Hawaii State Public Library System.

Develop Self-Awareness. We have grown up hearing the saying, "Knowing is half the battle," and sometimes just getting to know yourself and becoming self-aware is truly a battle. There are all sorts of personality tests, behavioral evaluations, and theories. The main purpose is to understand your strengths, weaknesses, triggers, communication style, and the reasons why you exhibit certain behaviors. This is not to excuse poor behavior but to identify areas to work on, develop your strengths, improve communication skills, and strengthen relationships with others.

Network and find a mentor. Create a network of professionals and friends in the community who can support your goals and provide exposure to new experiences and perspectives. Reach out to others in the company, join a professional group in your industry or online, or volunteer for a non-profit organization. You never know the impact one conversation can have on your life. For example, talking with Bus Operator Kimberly Alston led to OTS employees volunteering at the NAACP's annual youth day, attending their annual ball with my family, VP's speaking at the women's prison, and my husband and VP of

Maintenance Adam Tamayoshi teaching at the Halawa Correctional Facility. During a health class, I met an HR professional with decades of experience who became a mentor to me and connected me with volunteer opportunities at SHRM Hawaii. This led to joining an HR Leadership Book Club, forming a network of HR professionals in various industries, working with attorneys, coaches, and published authors, and obtaining my SHRM-SCP certification.

Show Initiative. Take the initiative to learn as much as you can in your department. Offer to learn the work of your coworkers and cross train to be their backup when they are out of the office. Talk story with people from other departments to understand their role and duties to be able to see the big picture of OTS. Ask for help and assistance when needed, making use of all the resources available to you such as your manager, Human Resources, Civil Rights Office, and the Employee Assistance Program. Take courses in your field or on management, watch videos online, research certifications available in your field, and communicate your career goals with management. Ask for, and be willing to accept, honest feedback on your work. When applying for a promotional job posting, be sure your application includes details on how you meet the required qualifications. 

The Customer Services team prepared to welcome Skyline into the Honolulu Public Transit System prior to opening. Here are a few of the many activities that took place before the start of the train service. TheBus Information staff transitioned to the Transit Information staff. This team incorporated 19 new and modified bus routes, bringing the grand total knowledge base to 117 bus routes. They also learned details on the nine Skyline stations and train service. When you call the Information Office, they will greet you with, "Aloha, Transit Information"!

Transit Pass Office staff produced nearly 6,000 TheHandi-Van HOLO cards for eligible active riders to access the Skyline stations. Customer Service staff mailed the HOLO cards with brochures to ensure the riders would receive them prior to the start of Skyline service.

Customer Communications and Information Technology departments created a new TheBus website design and created the new TheHandi-Van website. The new websites provide an easier way to access public transit information.

Updated Telephone System

To make it easy for transit riders to access Honolulu transit information, some changes were made to the telephone system. When callers dial 808-848-5555, they can now select from the following menu options:

- 1 Honolulu Estimated Arrival (HEA): This option now includes Skyline service.
- 2 Transit Information
- 3 HOLO Customer Service: Callers can also reach them directly at 808-768-4656.
- 4 Skyline Customer Service: Same day train Lost and Found
- 5 TheBus Customer Service: Reduced fare programs and Lost & Found

New Senior & Youth HOLO Cards

We are always looking for ways to reduce lines at the Transit Pass Office and provide a convenient service to distribute HOLO cards to ride transit. Recently, we expanded our online HOLO card order system to include our Kupuna. Oahu residents age 65 and over that have a Hawaii Driver's License or Hawaii State ID can now fill out our online form to have their new HOLO card mailed to their residence. The HOLO Youth online application form is still available for riders 6-17 years of age. Youth includes high school students up to 19 years of age who have a valid high school identification card or proof of enrollment.
